


An SDCW Executive meeting conference call was held October 4, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. and included: Brenda D, Mary J, Kodi B, Evie F, Karla P, Lindy H, Carol S, Ruth F and Shirley T.

Lindy gave an update on what she has been checking out for using the plastic card for beef certificates sales. She has visited with Nancy Montross of the Cattlemen's Auxiliary and they use First Dakota National Bank of Yankton. It will take up to two years to set-up. Other banks were contacted and will get back to her.

Kodi is working on the "structured directory". She wants a contact for each club. In the past, the president of the club or person appointed by the president was the delegate. She still has questions on some items.

Evie has suggested using a "google" form with a spread sheet to keep track of everything and the inventory. This still needs to be ironed out. This should also include cut-off dates for bills and AR's to be done.

Brenda setup a sub-committee of Evie, Chairman and Karla, Kodi and Ruth to figure out how to get items from Tammy's garage and the SDSGA office and how much there is, etc. This is due by the November phone call.

Kodi plans to put together a structured directory of what each officer is in charge of.

Karla spoke on the band festival in Chamberlain. It is the same as planned. She needs 750 pieces of jerky. Prime will be available with gummy burgers and hot dogs and have a float.

Kodi has "ABC Beef Books" and would like to put them in the rest areas and make annual reports.

Next newsletter deadline is November 1. Next conference call will be Wednesday, Nov. 1, at 9:00 a.m. CT to include updates on the beef certificate card and Evie's plan.

Evie will visit with Sylvia of the SDSGA about the SDCW cost for using the convention room at the Ramkota in Rapid City and get the information to Brenda.

Brenda thanked those on the call and adjourned the meeting at 9:45 a.m.

President Brenda Dreyer called the meeting to order at 10:30 a.m. MDT. The flag salute was led by Mary Jessen and the CattleWomen's Creed was led by Penny Zimmerman. Introductions of all present were shared.

Penny Zimmerman, National ANCW President from Minnesota, was introduced and gave comments and showed a power point of ANCW activities. Her theme for this year is "Alone we can do little, Together we can do so much". She spoke of committees that ANCW have and ideas we can take form them for our state organization. The National ANCW meeting will be Monday, January 29, 2018, in Phoenix, Arizona. Brenda presented Penny with a gift from the SDCW.

Becky Littau, treasurer, gave the SDCW and BIC account reports. She stressed that BIC bills for 2017 need to be given to her ASAP, before September 30. A discussion was held on the BIC budget reduction. Anyone needing promo items, etc. should get their request to Brenda by September 27.

Mary Hendricks gave the investment report. It was discussed that other sources of income can be used for expenses. Lindy H. moved and Julie H. second to approve the report to be filed. Motion passed.

Mary Jessen gave the secretary's report. Julie moved and Kodi second to accept the report as printed in the newsletter. Motion passed.

Clubs present (Southern Belles, Southern Hills, Harrold Steakettes and Prime) gave reports on projects they have done during the year.

Julie H. and Penny Z. discussed the Region III and VII meeting they attended in Nebraska. North Dakota will host the 2018 meeting.

The group broke for lunch at 12:10 p.m., resuming at 12:45.
OLD BUSINESS:

Summer activities discussion. The new logo will be used. The logo did not cost the SDCW anything as Brenda had lined it up with businesses in Aberdeen.

A suggestion was made to put a "thank you" to Tammy Basel in the newsletter for work she has done with the "Beef Up Black Hills" project.

Carol Sides moved and Ruth F. seconded to increase money needed in the BIC account due to decrease in funds available. Could possibly use beef certificate money. Motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS:

Lindy gave the beef certificate report. Sales are down so far this year. A discussion was held on using the plastic card. Lindy suggested to begin using at the first of the year. Kodi, Becky and Lindy were appointed as a committee to explore the plastic card usage and which bank to use.

Storage Unit Inventory: Evie F. suggested putting on a database what is in the shed. Could have a form on the website to show what is available and what has been taken out. Karla P. and Evie will try to keep a running inventory.

Communication Planning: Discussed different forms of communication available. Kodi will put together a "structured directory" report.

Website: Karla and Kodi are working on this.

ANCW Silent Auction for 2017: Kodi moved and Ruth seconded to pay \$150.00 from the SDCW account to cover the cost of the item bought together with other states for the ANCW silent auction. Motion passed. Penny says ANCW would like suggestions to fundraise in place of the auction. The SDCW tabled the silent auction item for the future until we receive more information.

Beef County report and promotion: The SDCW needs to go from a hard copy report to social media. BIC does want to partner with SDCW. The BIC budget for SDCW for 2018 is as follows:

Air Base, \$1,500.00; Beef Up Black Hills, \$3,500.00; Consumer Education, \$3,000.00; Powered by Beef, \$2,000.00; Youth Beef Education, \$2,500.00; Consumer Education, \$4,000.00 and other, \$1,000.00. Total approved by BIC: \$20,000.00.

The budges were cut. We need to look at priorities and re-evaluate financial resources, membership resources and consumers. Lindy moved and Mary H. seconded to accept the budget as presented. Motion passed.

The SDCW received a letter from the Western Junior Livestock Show asking for a donation of \$50.00 to buy a rosette to be used as an award at their event. Kodi moved and Mary H. seconded to do so. Motion passed.

Kodi gave nominations of officers to be elected as follows: Brenda Dreyer, president; Evie Fortune, vice president; Becky Littau, treasurer and Mary Jessen, secretary. Mary H. moved to re-elect the slate given unanimously. Carol Sides seconded and motion passed.

Brenda did ask for an active vice president. The candidate selected offered to do just that.

An executive phone call will be held on Wednesday, October 4, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. CDT with a 45-minute limit. Brenda will get the 800 number to call and password code needed to members.

Brenda needs any reports due by Wednesday, September 27. Kodi moved to adjourn and Evie seconded to do so at 3:00 p.m. MDT. Motion passed.

Executive Board meets

An SDCW Executive meeting Conference call was held at 9:00 a.m. Wednesday, November 1, 2017.

Those present for the call were: Brenda Dreyer, Mary Jessen, Becky Littau, Karla Pazour, Lindy Harkin, Katrin Van Zandbergen, Ruth Farnsworth, Evie Fortune, Carol Sides and Erin Yost. BIC was kind enough to let us use their conference call number this time. "Thank you!"

Brenda mentioned that today, November 1, is the newsletter deadline. The editor has not yet received the directory information. Becky, treasurer, spoke of the budget and that dues are coming in now.

Lindy talked about the beef certificate deal and the plastic card. First Dakota National Bank of Yankton and their other locations are no longer doing it.
