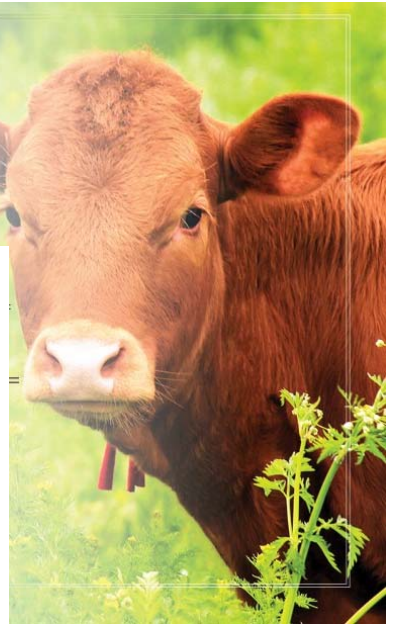

Evie gave her President's report and talked about the "new director orientation meeting" for BIC she had attended. She was impressed with the test kitchen that was setup. She plans to attend the ANCW Region meeting in Amana, Iowa.

MEMBERSHIP: Katrin V. was not present, but numbers were given in the last newsletter.

SCHOLARSHIP: Mary J. informed members that only one applicant applied this year, so was named the winner. She is Sydney Miller of Hot Springs and will receive a check for \$250.00 in the near future. Information was gotten out too late this year with contact information.

NEWSLETTER: Mary J. gave the next deadline as July 15 and will get reminders out. She suggested Florine Glaus and Pat Blum to be "spotlighted" in the next issue.

PROMOTION ITEMS: Items that need to be ordered by the clubs should be gotten to Lindy by June 19.

It was emphasized that personal names should not be put on websites - - they need to be protected - - privacy policy.

The annual convention with the South Dakota Stockgrowers Association was discussed. The SDSGA convention is planned for October 31 and November 1. The SDCW have agreed to do our annual meeting on Wednesday, August 14, 2019, at the Hall of Fame in Chamberlain at 11:00 a.m. CDT, 10:00 a.m. MDT. Evie plans to invite the ANCW National President from Montana

to be the noon speaker and then have tours of the Hall of Fame, St. Joseph Indian School Museum and other points of interest in Chamberlain. The SDCW will still have a booth at the SDSGA convention. Prime will handle the lunch menu.

This year we had some new recipe cards, pens, pencils, and a few other things to hand out. Our popular item was the can koozie. The people really like getting new recipes. There were a few people that said they had been there before and had gotten one of the red insulated bags, or one of the meat thermometers, and they use them constantly. Again there were people who asked about fresh or bulk meat and we directed them to a website. There was also the website and Facebook addresses for cattlemen so they could get more recipes. We were told a number of times that they appreciated that we were there. It was a great day and we look forward to doing it again next year.



The name Florine Glaus is synonymous with CowBelles and known for her enthusiastic dedication to the beef industry. Florine is one of the twelve charter members who in 1971 formed the Prime CattleWomen affiliate in the Chamberlain area. From 1983 until 1986, she served on the South Dakota Beef Industry Council board. She has held all officer positions at both the local and state level.



She was the State CowBelle president in 1985-86 and during her term, she and Roger Husted, president of the Stockgrowers traveled the state attending meetings and gathering membership. There were 30 clubs and 630 State CowBelle members while she was state president.

During her presidency, she worked closely with the High School Home Economics departments and provided beef cookery materials for the classroom. Through the years, she assisted with the High School Beef Cook-Off and the State Fair Beef Booth. For many years, she was the contact person for the beef certificates in the Chamberlain area and worked directly with the local banks. She helped host the 2005 National Beef Cook-Off in Rapid City, serving on the Registration committee.

She encouraged participation in the Miss Stockgrower and Beef Ambassador contests, educating candidates so that they could represent our industry well. Always championing youth, Florine started the Clover Lassies 4-H Club and was a leader for 30 years; served as a director on the State Leader's Association. A parent commented 'she has always given so unselfishly, she would immediately drop what she was doing in order to help a 4-H'er with a project.' She aided her husband, John, who was the State Fair 4-H Beef Superintendent for 17 years.

Florine is a native of Isabel, SD and graduated from South Dakota State University (then college) with a Home Economics degree. She married John Glaus in 1949 and became the mother to four children - twin girls, a son and another daughter. She provided hands-on help at the ranch. She was known to be able to both drive silage truck and feed a table full of men. The Glaus Angus, founded in 1903, started production testing in 1955 and in 1961 was one of the first in South Dakota to use artificial insemination on a large scale.

Since 1988, the Glaus ranch provided valuable land, located along Interstate 90, so that a sign promoting beef could be seen by travelers. Last year, the sign once again got updated – with bright red background and a delicious burger, along with the tagline 'Beef. It's What's for Dinner.' The sign got paid for by our SDCW as the main financial sponsor, along with additional dollars coming from SDBIC, Southern Belles and Prime CattleWomen affiliates.

Bestowed honors included Little International (SDSU) Honored Homemaker (1980), Eminent Homemaker (1983), and South Dakota Beef Industry Prime Promoter (2010). Of course, her greatest honors are her family. She was married to John for 62 years, losing him in 2011. Her children are daughter, Janet (Roger) Wehde of Sioux Falls and their daughter, Kelsey (Garrett) of Sarasota, Fl.; daughter, June (husband Arden passed in 2019) Shields of Harrisburg, SD and children, Lee of Colorado; Amy (Andy) of Lennox and Sarah (Matt) of Harrisburg; son, Jim (Sholi) Glaus of Chamberlain and children, Tate (Cheyenne) and baby daughter Davy; Teil (Clarissa) and baby son, Boone, daughters, Savanna and Mariah, all of Chamberlain; Troy (Rosa) of Brookings with daughters, Cara Ann, Jolena, Tia, and Malia; daughter, Barb (Don) Walker of Piedmont and sons, Clint (Katy) and children, Ella, Landon and Ridley of Sturgis; Ben, who just returned from overseas serving in the military and Sam of Piedmont.

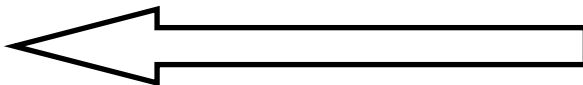

BEEF Expands Its Rally™ Footprint with Sturgis® Beef Throw Down Event

The venue allows beef to reach nearly a half million consumers from all over the world throughout the ten-day event scheduled for August 2-11, 2019.

New to the Event this year is the "Sturgis® Beef Throw Down". Join the fun as we travel the beautiful Black Hills area with Food Network professional chef Justin Warner. Warner will be judging destination location restaurant's signature beef dish, alongside designated South Dakota beef producers! The "Sturgis® Beef Throw Down" judging will take place August 5-7, 2019, with the winner announced at noon MST on August 8 during the 79th Sturgis® Motorcycle Rally™ on the Rally Point Stage. The winning restaurant will receive a trophy to display in their establishment, as well as team slot in the Sanford International Senior PGA Pro-Am tour, taking place September 18-19, 2019, in Sioux Falls, SD.

"We really wanted to expand our footprint with the Rally™ this year, so we worked alongside the City of Sturgis in the development of the "Sturgis® Beef Throw Down", states Suzy Geppert, SDBIC Executive Director. "We know that one of the main draws for Rally™ attendees is the beauty of the Black Hills in western South Dakota and many of them spend a lot of time on their bikes touring. We wanted to be able to allow attendees the ability to incorporate beef into their experience, so we established an opportunity to do just that."

Rally™ attendees will have an opportunity to take an optional "Sturgis® Beef Throw Down" tour. Attendees will start when they check in at the Sturgis® Rally™ Headquarters, where they will be given a Sturgis® Beef Throw Down Passport that contains all participating restaurants. Attendees will then travel to participating restaurants and purchase the signature beef dish at each location on the map. The restaurant will stamp the passport to confirm the signature beef dish was ordered. Participants bring the stamped passport back to Rally Point for a chance to win one of five prize packages that include \$100 up to \$500 in Beef Bucks, alongside beef swag! Attendees must have a minimum of three destination locations stamped to qualify for entry! Passports may also be downloaded at sdbeef.org.

Potato Pizza Hot Dish

- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1 can tomato soup
- 1/2 tsp. oregano

- 1 onion, chopped to taste
- 4 cups frozen hash brown potatoes, thawed
- 1/4 cup onion chopped
- 1/4 tsp. pepper

- 1 can cheddar cheese soup
- 1/2 tsp. sugar

Shredded mozzarella cheese for topping

Brown ground beef with onion and drain; put in large casserole dish. Combine cheddar cheese soup and milk; spread over beef layer, spread to edges. Layer hash browns for next layer. Combine tomato soup, onion, sugar, oregano and pepper; layer over hash browns, spread to edges. Bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes. Top with shredded mozzarella cheese, cover and bake additional 15 minutes.
